Hello, Fellow Friends and Supporters,

We are pleased to offer the spring Newsletter full of reports of the activities of the Friends since last fall. We hope you will enjoy reading about them, even if you participated in them.

The 2017 Annual Appeal was a great success, thanks to the generosity of our members and supporters. We sent out 300 letters and raised a total of \$8,295, which allows us to insure that Sunday hours continue and to fund other new initiatives.

# **March Book Bag Sale**

This year's book sale was even more successful than in previous years. Between the sale itself, the bake sale and Book Stop proceeds from the day, we made a total of \$1,164.95.

We provided a wide array of books, including paperbacks and hardcovers in fiction and non-fiction. Customers filled up large bags with books for \$7.00. Depending on how full your bag was, you might be paying only fifty cents a book. Friends are allowed inside half an hour early, so that they have first choice of books.

All proceeds from the sale go to the library to support programs like inter-library loan and purchases of children's books and computers.

Were you one of the roughly 400 people who showed up for the Library's fifth Open House — Love vour Library; vour Library loves vou? This annual event started as a staff initiative, and it's considered a Library program, but there is no way we could make this happen without you Friends! This is also just one of around 800 programs for kids and adults here at the Library. I recently completed the Annual Report to the City of Rockland (Fiscal Year 2017; which ended June 30). Did vou know that more than 4,000 hours were donated to the Library last year? We still have a number of volunteer opportunities at the Library, among them shelving books and putting shelves in order, poster deliveries, and the always glamorous trash pickup. 
